Great ShakeOut Earthquake Drills

Childcare and Pre-School

At 10:19 a.m. on October 19, 2023, millions of people will "Drop, Cover, and Hold On" in The Great ShakeOut, the world's largest earthquake drill ever! All childcare centers, in-home childcare, and pre-schools are encouraged to participate in the drill (or plan a more extensive exercise).

Major earthquakes may happen anywhere you live, work, or travel. The ShakeOut is our chance to practice how to protect ourselves, and for everyone to become prepared. The goal is to prevent a major earthquake from becoming a catastrophe for you, your organization, and your community.

Why is a "Drop, Cover, and Hold On" drill important? To respond quickly you must practice often. You may only have seconds to protect yourself in an earthquake before strong shaking knocks you down, or something falls on you.



Millions of people worldwide have participated in Great ShakeOut Earthquake Drills since 2008. The Great ShakeOut is held on the third Thursday of October each year.

Everyone can participate! Individuals, families, businesses, schools, colleges, government agencies and organizations are all invited to register.

HOW TO PARTICIPATE

Plan Your Drill:

- Register at ShakeOut.org/register to be counted as participating, get email updates, and more.
- Download a Drill Broadcast recording from ShakeOut.org/drill/broadcast.
- Have a "Drop, Cover, and Hold On" drill at 10:19 a.m. on October 19. You can also practice other aspects of your emergency plan.
- Discuss what you learned and make improvements.

Get Prepared for Earthquakes:

- Identify items that might fall and cause injury, and secure them with appropriate seismic restraints.
- Create and/or update your disaster plan.
- Check your emergency supplies; make sure they are fresh, accessible and functional.
- Encourage staff and children to prepare at home.
- Provide first aid and response training for staff.

Share the ShakeOut:

- Encourage staff and children's families to ask their friends and neighbors to register.
- Ask colleagues at other facilities to participate.



Get Tested.

We recommend getting tested as soon as possible if you are experiencing COVID-19 symptoms, even if you are vaccinated.

You should also get tested if:

- You have been in close contact with someone who has COVID-19
- You have taken part in activities that put you at higher risk for COVID-19, such as travel, attending large gatherings, or being in crowded indoor settings
- Your employer requires routine screening

Additional Doses

Additional doses of the mRNA COVID-19 vaccines are available for those who are immunocompromised 28 days after they complete the initial series. An additional dose of the Pfizer or Moderna vaccine is recommended for immunocompromised individuals to achieve maximum protection from the vaccine series. People are encouraged to talk to their health care provider about whether an additional dose is appropriate for them. For more information about additional doses of COVID-19 vaccine, go to cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/vaccines/recommendations/immuno.html.

Boosters

Residents who completed a two-dose series of the Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine at least 5 months ago are encouraged to get a booster dose.

Residents who received the Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine at least two months ago are encouraged to get a booster dose.

Residents may choose to receive any authorized or approved vaccine as their booster dose.
