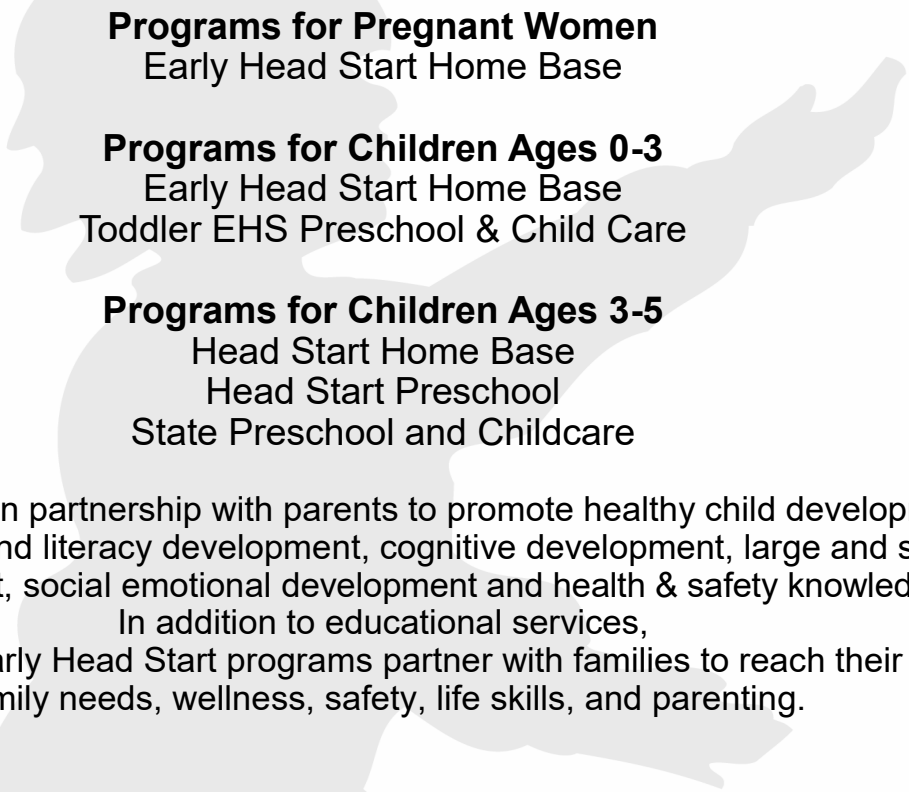

Applications need to include a copy of immunizations for the child and proof of household income.

Ideas para ponerse en contacto con recursos de la comunidad	

- Antes de llamar escriba lo que quiera preguntar o saber. Cuando llame por teléfono a los recursos potenciales, es posible guiarlos para discutir cual información pueden tener para usted o su familia.*
- Explique la razón de la llamada, que necesita, y el numero y las edades de sus niños: “Vivo en Arcata. Soy una madre con dos niños - uno tiene 4 años y la otra tiene 2 años. Quiero asistir a una clase de crianza de niños. Necesito cuidado de niños cuando asisto en las clases.”
 - Tenga una pluma y un papel listos para que escriba cualquiera información que le den.
 - Pregunte de las funciones exactos que ofrece el recurso y decida si es algo que usted necesita:
 - Es importante obtener la información que sigue: localidad de servicios; nombre de la persona con quien ponerse en contacto; las horas de servicio; precio; requisitos de elegibilidad y como aplicar.
 - Pida que manden la información necesaria y cualquier papeleo que explica más el recurso. De su nombre y domicilio.
 - Si la persona con quien hable no le puede ayudar, pregúntele a quien le puede llamar.
 - ¡No pierda las esperanzas! Si no está seguro donde puede llamar, llame a uno de los números aquí en este guía. Es posible que no haya hispanohablantes en todos los lugares. Por eso, encuentre a alguien que habla inglés (como una maestra o trabajadora social) para hacer una cita y/o para traducir.

About Contacting Resources

- When contacting potential resources, you can guide community personnel in discussing information about what they have to offer you or your family. Before calling, write down what you want to ask or know.
- Explain why you are calling, what you or your children need and the number and ages of your children:
“I am calling from Arcata. I am the mother of a 2 and 4 year old, and I would like to take a parenting class. I will need child care while I attend classes.”
 - Have a pen and paper ready to write down any information you may receive.
 - Ask for the resource’s specific functions (what do they do?) and decide if any of them match your needs:
 - If you feel that you would benefit from the program, get the following information: Location of services, name of a contact person (if any), hours of service, fee, eligibility requirements and how to apply.
 - Ask the resources personnel to send you the necessary brochures or other paperwork that further explain the resource. Give your name and address.
 - If the person with whom you spoke cannot help you, ask for the name of someone else you can call for the same service.
 - Don’t give up! If you are not sure of exactly where to call, try calling **211** Humboldt or any other number listed in this guide. Work with your home visitor, family worker, or center teacher to reach the resources you need.
